

Only "teething problems?"

- Difficulties in producing a journal with cooperation over three continents
- Printing still needs a long time
- Printing quality is sometimes poor
- Distribution of the journal is delayed
- \Rightarrow How long will we get money from UMS?



One way to solve the problems


- Publish only on the WWW
- \Rightarrow Problems with taxonomy
- \Rightarrow Problems if the journal closes down

Problems with authors

- Scientific "top-stories" are published in other journals (e.g. Myrmecological News)
- Rapid or poorly designed studies cannot be accepted as full papers
- Editors have to work more hard to produce publishable papers from the manuscripts
- => Although we have the appropriate readership there is the danger that **AM** will become a newsletter rather than a scientific journal
